# A Reprint Story by Richard Kitner about a Veteran's Wish

The following appeared in an issue of the Hanover Evening Sun, Community Times section on June 8, 2003. The author is Richard Kitner who wrote articles about veterans titled "For Those Who Served" on the second Sunday of the month for the Hanover Evening Sun and the Gettysburg Times. Richard is a member of the American Legion Post #262 in Biglerville, Pa. For a time, he ran a non-profit thrift store with all the monies going to provide transportation for veterans, the disabled and elderly to and from their appointments at VA hospitals in Martinsburg, WV and Lebanon, Pa. Richard has given his permission for this article to be reprinted and shared.

He began his article with:

Over the past few months, I have received a plethora of stories regarding veterans as well as active duty military. I would like to share this one with you. Hope the "Hollywood Elite" as well as Jane Fonda also reads!

The wife of a Viet Nam veteran wrote this and although the first name is the same, no, it is not about me. Richard, (my husband), never really talked a lot about his time in Viet Nam other than he had been shot by a sniper. However, he had a rather grainy, 8 x 10 black and white photo he had taken at a USO show of Ann Margaret with Bob Hope in the background that was one of his treasures.

A few years ago, Ann Margaret was doing a book signing at a local bookstore. Richard wanted to see if he could get her to sign the treasured photo so he arrived at the bookstore at 12 o'clock for the 7:30 pm signing. When I got there after work, the line went all the way around the bookstore, circled the parking lot, and disappeared behind a parking garage.

Before her appearance, bookstore employees announced that she would sign only her book and no memorabilia would be permitted. Richard was disappointed, but wanted to show her the photo and let her know how much those shows meant to lonely GI's so far from home. Ann Margaret came out looking as beautiful as ever and, as 2<sup>nd</sup> in line, it was soon Richard's turn. He presented the book for her signature and then took out the photo.

When he did, there were many shouts from the employees that she would not sign it. Richard said, "I understand. I just wanted her to see it." She took one look at the photo, tears welled up in her eyes and she said, "This is one of my gentlemen from Viet Nam and I most certainly will sign his photo. I know what these men did for their country and I always have time for "my gentlemen". With that, she pulled Richard across the table and planted a big kiss on him. She then made quite a to-do about the bravery of the young men she met over the years, how much she admired them, and how much she appreciated them. There weren't too many dry eyes among those close enough to hear. She then posed for pictures and acted as if he was the only one there.

Later, at dinner, Richard was very quiet. When I asked if he'd like to talk about it, my big strong husband broke down in tears. "That's the first time anyone ever thanked me for my time in the Army," he said. That night was a turning point for him. He walked a little straighter and for the first time in years, was proud to have been a Vet.

I'll never forget Ann Margaret for her graciousness and how much that small act of kindness meant to my husband. I now make it a point to say "Thank you!" to every person I come across who served in our Armed Forces.

Freedom does not come cheap and I am grateful for all those who have served their country. .... *Richard Kitner*

*How many times have you heard someone say that no one ever said "Thank You" to them? Let's all try to say those two small words to any and all Vets that we meet! It would mean the world to them.*

## Final Letter Home

This information came from Post 200 member, Gary Jestes. His friend, Franklin Underwood, Jr. and he went to Sykesville High School together. They both served in the U.S. Army's 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division in Vietnam. The Underwood family has given permission to share his last letter home.

*Dear Dad,*

*June 18, 1969*

*You can take this letter for what it's worth. I am now in Cam Rand Bay 6 Convalescent Center which is a hospital. Ok, here I go.....*

*I have about 40 days left in country and I was offered a job here. I'll give you the background of how I got it. When I came here I was made Barrack Sgt. of 3 wards which means making sure that the men got medication and that they were taken care of properly. The NCO in charge was pleased with my work and the wards were \_\_\_\_\_up. I got them in A-1 condition that he offered me the job of being field officer of a company of patients. I thought about taking this job to keep me safe until I got home with my loved ones.*

*I had to make one of the biggest decisions of my life. My platoon leader is also wounded and in Japan. So that leaves my platoon (which I have fought, cried, helped, laughed and instructed with) with a E5 Sgt. that is new in country and don't know nothing to lead my platoon of men to kill the Viet Cong and NVA. So I made the decision not to cover my own ass, but to help my men to maybe live to go back to the field and lead and fight.*

*So what I want to say now is. If I get hurt or killed, it was my own decision. We are now in the Ashaw Valley which is an area that has a lot of Viet Cong and North Viet Army soldiers which we are fighting. My platoon has had 3 killed and I don't know how many wounded.*

*Please take care of Mom, Dave and Tom and especially Barb if anything happens to me. I'm sure you understand what I'm trying to say. My men need me and I'm sure I can save somebody's life if I try. What I want you to please do is give this letter to Sgt. Kitchen and let him read it. Dad, Sgt. Kitchen helped me a lot once and I want him to know what I'm thinking also right now. Please.*

*May God watch over me and help me.*

On June 23, 1969, Staff Sergeant Frank Underwood was killed while attempting to aid in the evacuation of his men from a burning, crashed helicopter. On August 25, 1969, Franklin Underwood was awarded The Soldier's Medal, posthumously for his heroism.

The paperwork stated that the reason for the award was as follows:

For heroism not involving actual conflict with an armed enemy in the Republic of Vietnam on 23 June 1969, Staff Sergeant Underwood distinguished himself while serving as platoon sergeant in Company C, 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 506<sup>th</sup> Infantry, during combat operation in the A Shau Valley, Republic of Vietnam. At approximately 1400 hours on the cited date, a CH-47 helicopter in which he was a passenger crashed into the supply pad at Fire Support Base Airborne. The crippled ship instantly burst into flames, which ignited the highly explosive fougasse and artillery ammunition stored nearby. With little regard for his own safety, Sergeant Underwood selflessly began to guide the injured personnel out of the burning craft toward safety. By carrying injured men and offering words of encouragement to the others, he aided in the evacuation of seventeen men from the burning craft. Fearing that more of his comrades might still be trapped, he remained inside the burning helicopter valiantly searching for injured personnel. It was during this courageous attempt to save his fellow soldiers that he died. Sergeant Underwood's personal bravery and devotion to duty were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army.

About the MCVET Center

MCVET stands for the Maryland Center for Veterans Education and Training. They are located at 301 North High Street in Baltimore. They serve more than 250 veterans daily, through five distinct programs; a day drop-in program; an emergency program (13 weeks); a transitional housing program (up to 2 years); a follow-up program; and 80 single room occupancy apartments (SRO). A natural progression will be to go from the day drop-in program to the emergency program, to the transitional housing; to the SRO. Veteran applicants from outside MCVET's program, including female veterans, are also accepted into the SRO program, provided they meet the eligibility requirements. As the veterans enrolled at MCVET travel through this continuum, they receive an array of services that support the primary goal of empowering them to return to the families and communities. During the cold winter months, they take in the city's homeless.

They offer a military-structured, seamless continuum of care that helps veterans in need, transition from dependent to independent living.

We recently had a collection box in the lobby of the post and the response was phenomenal. **Thank you to all who donated items to MCVETS.** We will do it again sometime in the future.

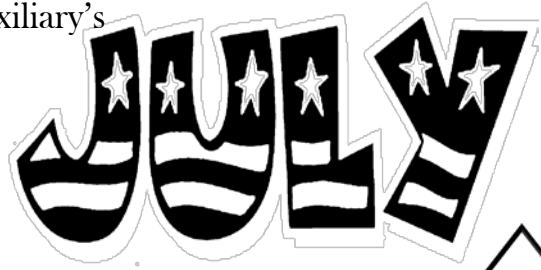
